# Minutes of Calgary Girls Charter School School Council Meeting held on Tuesday, June 11th, 2019 at 7:00pm Lakeview Campus Learning Commons

## D. Student Presentation: Grade 6 Go Girls Mental Health Program

This was an Innovation project funded by the School council.

The project started off with a brainstorming session with students answering the following questions:

- What does big worries look like?
- What do people look like when they are having big worries?
- How can friends help?

During the session, there were discussions around perfectionism, positive mental health, study skills strategies, anxiety, as well as, videos and literature around these subjects to foster learning.

All of these culminated in a Mental Health symposium which held on May 14, 2019. The symposium hosted Mental health specialist, Dr. Allan Donsky, as well as, Art, Music, Nature and Animal therapists. The Therapists shared strategies and there were activities and workshops around exercise, yoga, mindfulness and crafts.

There was a debriefing session at the end, to discuss strategies and their practical applications.

#### Suggestion:

• Hold a repeat session involving the entire school as all grades will benefit.

• Organize a display table at BBQ event in September with information/resources for parents around helpful strategies/tips for students

In response, Elizabeth W. noted that there were plans to incorporate an online Mental Health resources center on the school's website.

## E. Reports

#### i. Co-Chair -

Elizabeth W. conveyed her gratitude to volunteers for their hard work throughout the year and presented roses. In addition, gifts were presented to the outgoing executives (Amy C. And Lianne K.) for their contributions and support to the Executive team and the School Council in general.

#### ii. Superintendent – John Picard

John P. commended the school administration for the synergy demonstrated though this was only the first year of their tenure. The sense of trust, cohesion, congeniality always on display was notable and he remarked that this was based on shared values, strong belief in school and competence. His observations were further supported by the feedback from staff following the survey conducted via Survey Monkey, survey also highlighted potential growth areas.

Board Speak out: This Go girls activity was outstanding and look forward to having parents participate at future events. The school also rolled out new logo, name and website to embolden the mission, vision and values of the school.

Courtyard: The intention is for this to be a community space. The Board has been in discussions on the installation of an irrigation system for the courtyard, this is considered critical to sustaining the huge investment in the courtyard. Board is looking to partner with the school council on this.

#### Summary of Innovation projects funded by School Council

Grade 4s (Classroom Libraries): Students are working to research, analyze, purchase and use classroom libraries to build literacy. This library will continue to inspire grade 4s in the future.

Grade 5s (Indigenous Education): Students visited Weaselhead and spent time engaging with the land and building community.

Grade 6s (Go Girls Mental Health Program): Shared their wonderful work earlier this evening

Grade 7s (Sharing Indigenous Culture): Pursued creative ideas to share Indigenous culture with hoop dancing and drumming as the current focus

Grade 8s (Art Pieces): Sculpting, firing, painting, warping, weaving clay looms. Innovation funds helped to provide all the materials needed for these incredible projects. Girls are incredibly proud of their work. Girls designed with concepts from across the curriculum and from the entire year

Grade 9s (River Watch field study): Students went on a rafting trip for this field study where they learned about water quality and made connections to environmental chemistry and social studies.

Dear Edwina: recorded the largest turnout ever, the most number of kids ever to audition and the largest cast ever.

Fine Art: a video of the girls during Bruce Horak's performance of, 'Assassinating Thomson' was played, his artwork which was painted in the course of the performance was also on display at the meeting.

The school community is excited to have Foothills Brass join us for a performance tomorrow, Wednesday, June 12. Grade 8s and 9s that play brass instruments will also be performing alongside the group.

PE: Instructors and students appreciate the jerseys. Athletes looked great and were so excited to have team wear. The soccer tournament is tomorrow, Wednesday, June 12 and it's been a great addition to the sport opportunities for students.
